In September 2010 Councillor Martin Cornforth plans to climb Mont Blanc, the highest mountain in the Alps.

He hopes to achieve this with his three younger brothers in memory of his Dad who died of cancer almost three years ago.

All the brothers are experienced climbers but in Martin's case the last time he strapped on his crampons or used an ice axe was 1982. So it's not just the ice axe that's a little rusty.

As youngsters it was their Dad who first took them on to the fells of the Lake District and who fostered a love for the outdoors. An ascent of Mont Blanc seemed a suitable tribute, especially if his memory can be toasted with an appropriate Highland malt, on the summit.

Martin hopes to raise some sponsorship money to support the Macmillan Nurses who helped to nurse his Dad at home during the last months of his life.

Long Standing Councillor Resigns



Councillor Rosemary Collict, a North Ward Councillor resigned at the end of May for personal reasons after serving Seaford Town Council for over 11 years.

Rosemary, of Balmoral Close has been a Town Councillor since the creation of the Council in 1999, she also previously served as a Lewes District Councillor for 8 years.

Rosemary was one of a group of people who campaigned for the creation of a Town Council in Seaford. She served as Mayor to the town in 2006/07 and immediately before her resignation was Chairman of Finance & General Purposes Committee and Deputy Leader of the Council.

Councillors paid tribute to her work and dedication to the town at a recent Town Council meeting. Town Clerk, Sam Shippen, has been asked to bring a report to a future meeting of the Council detailing how the Council can recognise the long service and dedication given by Rosemary.
