

STATEMENT OF REASONS (Lewes District)

In order to improve road safety, assist with access for emergency vehicles, aid access for refuse vehicles, ease congestion, improve the environment for residents and create formal Disabled Bays both for residents near their homes and at specific destinationswe are proposing to introduce changes to parking controls.

Station Road, Seaford

There is a long history of complaints from local residents about parked cars obstructing driveways along the eastern side of Station Road. There is a particularly high demand for parking at this location as it is near Bishopstone railway station and is often used for parking by commuters.

To resolve the problems caused by parked cars on this length of road it is proposed to install double yellow lines on the western side of Station Road from its junction with Hawth Hill.

It is also proposed to install a short length of double yellow lines on the east side of Station Road at its junctions with Hawth Hill to prevent parked cars obstructing the view of traffic exiting the road.

Hawth Hill, Seaford

Local residents of Hawth Hill raised concerns that the restriction in Station Road would move parking into adjoining roads. In order to reduce the displacement of parking it is also proposed to introduce double yellow lines from its junction with Marine Parade along the northern side to its junction with Hawth Park Road.

It is also proposed to prohibit waiting on a section of the southern side from the junction with Hawth Park Road down the hill as there have been many complaints regarding obstructive parking from residents and the local bus company.

Hawth Park Road, Seaford

It is proposed to prohibit waiting between 8am and 6pm Mon to Sat on the western side of the bend within Hawth Park Road. The new proposal is intended to prevent all day parking by commuters and football supporters on the bend and to provide clear sightlines at this section.



To inform the Committee of ESCC's response to a pedestrian crossing on the A259 at Claremont Road and the speed limit

on the A259 near Hill Rise.

Recommendations

You are recommended:

1. To consider the response from ESCC and decide what action if any to take.

1. Information

- During a meeting of this Committee held on 13 March 2014 it was agreed that the priority of proposed road schemes would be;
 - (i) The provision of crossing on the A259 in the vicinity of the Clermont/Belgrave/Beacon Road, Seaford
 - (ii) Speed reduction in the Bishopstone Road area on the A259 (Newhaven Road).
- 1.2 The Council followed up this decision with ESCC asking for information with regards to the Community Match Fund for these schemes.
- 1.3 The response from the Project Manager in the Infrastructure Design & Delivery Department is as follows:
- 1.4 "Firstly regarding a pedestrian crossing of the A259 at Claremont Road.

 Without having looked in detail at the proposal I would very much imagine that this will need to be a light controlled crossing, rather than a zebra, and due to the road width it could potentially need to be a staggered crossing (crossing each lane separately, like at Denton roundabout). Standard puffin type crossings cost in the region of £80,000 to construct, with a stagger, it would be more say around



£110,000, and in any event the cost will depend on exactly what other changes (to kerblines/drainage etc) are also required to safely introduce the scheme.

There would then be design costs on top of that, which could typically be in the region of 20-25% of the design costs for a scheme of this nature, to include preliminary design, surveys, detailed design and construction supervision. The overall cost of a providing crossing here could therefore potentially be approaching £150,000.

As I said this cost information is provided without having carried out any investigation or design, and can only be indicative at this stage. Should you wish to apply and be successful for Community Match funding, then the very first stage would be to carry out a scheme scoping/feasibility assessment, and to provide you with better outline costs, and explain the risks that could change these costs.

In terms of sharing the costs, the table below explains how this would work.

Scheme phase	Community cost proportion	ESCC cost proportion
Feasibility/scoping	0	100%
Preliminary design cost	100%	0
Detailed design cost	At least 50%	Up to 50%
Construction cost	At least 50%	Up to 50%

More details are available in our brochure which is available on our website <u>here</u> if you do not already have it.

Regarding a change in the speed limit on the A259 near Hill Rise, due to the nature of the environment and the complexities around introducing a reduced speed limit in this location, this is not something that can be considered through the Community Match Fund. It does however feature quite highly on the Councils list of priorities for speed limit reviews and will be investigated by our Road Safety Team along with a number of other sites across the County later this year".

2. Financial Appraisal

The financial costs to STC could approach £85K - £90K as mentioned above for the A259 Claremont Road crossing. The Council has no budget at present for this level of contribution.

EAST SUSSEX, SOUTH DOWNS AND BRIGHTON & HOVE WASTE AND MINERALS SITES PLAN – CONSULTATION DRAFT: 4^{th} JULY 2014 TO 5^{th} SEPTEMBER 2014

East Sussex County Council, Brighton & Hove City Council and the South Downs National Park Authority are jointly preparing new planning policy for the management of waste and production of minerals in East Sussex and Brighton & Hove. This Plan sets out where waste and minerals development may take place to meet the requirements contained within the Waste and Minerals Plan, adopted in February 2013. The Authorities intend to make certain documents available as part of this consultation for the public to inspect at local deposit points. We would therefore be very grateful if you would display the enclosed poster in a prominent position to make people aware of the consultation, and make the documentation available for inspection by anyone who asks to see it between 4 July and 5 September 2014.

Background

East Sussex County Council, Brighton & Hove City Council and the South Downs National Park Authority have responsibility for planning for the future management of waste and production of minerals within their administrative areas. The three Authorities are working in partnership to produce a joint waste and minerals plan for the area of East Sussex and Brighton & Hove and part of the South Downs National Park.

The Authorities have adopted a 'Waste & Minerals Plan' (WMP), which is an overarching strategy on managing waste and producing minerals. It has identified the need for additional capacity for recycling and recovery facilities for waste management. The Authorities <u>do not</u> need to identify any sites for the landfill of waste. There are policies in the WMP which guide decisions on planning applications.

What is the Waste & Minerals Sites Plan?

The Waste and Minerals Sites Plan will identify sites and detailed policies to meet the above future needs. The allocation of sites is important as this provides communities and the waste and minerals industry with certainty about where waste and minerals development can take place and would hopefully avoid planning by the appeal process.

The Need for Waste Sites

Additional facilities are needed to meet very high targets for recycling and recovery. The number of new facilities required will depend on the size of those that are developed. The WMP indicated this may be about 5 large sites or 15 small sites

What are Waste Sites - will they be bad neighbours?

Waste management is an area where technology is improving, with cleaner processes resulting in less impact. Modern waste management facilities can be incorporated within buildings and need not cause negative impacts such as odour or dust. For example, recycling facilities could be electronics disassembly or plastics recycling; recovery capacity may be provided by high-tech efficient processes that provide electricity.

How will the Sites Plan identify suitable sites for managing waste?

The initial search for sites has been away from sensitive environmental designations such as the South Downs National Park and High Weald Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. A Call for Sites was held between July and September 2013.

Detailed site appraisals have been carried out on a 'long list' of potential sites located across the Plan Area. These assessments have looked at possible effects of waste management development on environmental and historic designations and residential amenity, as well as transport and flood risk issues. The outcome of these appraisals has informed a shortlist of sites.

What is proposed is a range of options to guide the waste industry: (A) some sites are specifically identified as being suitable for waste development; (O) areas of opportunity for waste facilities on previously developed or allocated land; (S) areas of search for a waste site within major areas proposed for mixed development; (E) extensions to existing sites; and, (I) existing industrial estates suitable for waste development.



Public Consultation

The list is a combination of undeveloped sites and industrial estates. These have now been published for public consultation to seek the views of local communities, the waste industry, and landowners on the suitability of the sites for waste management development.

There are many suitable locations across the Plan Area. We are proposing criteria to guide choice by developers. These sites are not specifically identified.

The information gathered through the consultation will be used to make final decisions on the sites to be included in the final Sites Plan. This will be submitted to Government late next year for public examination.

Other content of the Sites Plan

The Sites Plan will also identify Minerals Safeguarding Areas and Minerals Consultation Areas, consider safeguarding railheads and wharves to enable more sustainable means of transport to be used to move waste and minerals. Criteria for consultation on waste safeguarding and the need to consider facilities to manage waste water is also included.

East Sussex County Council, Brighton & Hove City Council and the South Downs National Park Authority are currently consulting on a draft joint Waste and Minerals Sites Plan (WMSP). The WMSP builds on the adopted Waste and Minerals Plan and seeks to identify sites within the Plan Area which could be suitable for a waste management use. Just because a site has been identified as being suitable for a waste site, it does not necessarily mean that it will be developed or used for that purpose. No sites have been identified as landfill or landraise sites.

A range of options to guide development have been suggested in the WMSP and these are:

- Allocation of sites for potential waste uses:
- Areas of Opportunity on previously developed land;
- Areas of Search;
- · Expansion to existing sites.

There is also a criteria based policy for locating waste development on existing industrial estates.

This note has been produced to help you, at a glance, see if there is a site identified in the WMSP near to you. Against each site is the corresponding page number within the WMSP Consultation Draft, where you will find further information on the particular site. A schedule of the suitable existing industrial estates has been published as part of the consultation on the WMSP.


