20mph Scheme - Steyne Road/Sutton Avenue, Seaford

Purpose of Report:

To advise the Committee of the proposed Traffic Regulation Order relating to the mandatory full-time 20mph zone in Sutton Avenue and Steyne Road and adjacent side roads.

Recommendations

There are no officer recommendations for this item.

1. Information

- 1.1 Following the public consultation recently undertaken relating to the 20mph zone in Sutton Avenue and Steyne Road, the introduction of the mandatory full-time 20mph zone is supported by the majority of respondents and received approval for implementation from the County Council Lead Member board in February 2014.
- 1.2 The proposed TRO has been advertised since Friday 2 May 2014. A copy of the notice and plan showing the lengths of the road are attached in appendix A.
- 1.3 ESCC have issued a statement of reasons for the TRO as follows:

"According to Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, Sections 1 (1) (a) and (f), the County Council is proposing the above Order to prevent the likelihood of accident related to speeding and to preserve and improve the amenity along C30 Steyne Road and Sutton Avenue by creating a safer environment for children travelling to and from school, particularly pedestrians and cyclists.

The effect of the Order is to introduce a 20 mph speed limit on roads in the area of Annecy Catholic Primary School, Seaford Head Community College and Micklefield Nursery.

The 20 mph speed limit can be introduced without additional physical speed reducing features and will comprise a combination of 20mph zone signs on existing street furniture or 20mph roundels painted on the road surface."



1.4 If the committee wish to make an objection or other representations concerning this proposal, a response is required by 28 May 2014. However, this Committee agreed to support this option in the meeting held on 12 December 2013.

EAST SUSSEX COUNTY COUNCIL ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 The East Sussex (Various Roads, Seaford) (20 mph Speed Limit) Order 201*

Notice is hereby given that East Sussex County Council propose to make an Order under Section 84 (1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, which would introduce a 20 mph speed limit on the following lengths of road:-

20 mph Speed Limit

C30 Steyne Road/Sutton Avenue - from a point 80 metres west of its junction with U5468 Ashurst Road north eastwards to a point 20 metres east of its junction with U5311 Micklefield Way.

U5168 Bramber Road - for its entire length

U5311 Micklefield Way - for its entire length

U5524 Arundel Road - from a point 20 metres north of its junction with C30 Sutton Avenue southwards to its junction with Cuckmere Road.

U5447 Southdown Road - from a point 45 metres north of its junction with C30 Sutton Avenue southwards to a point 20 metres south of its junction with C30 Sutton Avenue.

U5453 Links Close - for its entire length

U5454 Darwall Drive - for its entire length

U5455 Hazeldene - for its entire length

U5455 Manor Road - from its junction with C30 Sutton Avenue northwards to its junction with Manor Road.

U5468 Ashurst Road - for its entire length

U5468 Dean Road - for its entire length

U5468 Heathfield Road - from its junction with C30 Steyne Road northwards to its junction with U5108 Bramber Road.

U5467 Links Road - from its junction with C30 Sutton Avenue southwards for a distance of 45 metres.



Proposed Stopping-up Order - North End of Antony Close

Purpose of Report:

To inform the Committee of an application for a Stopping-up

Order.

Recommendations

You are recommended:

1. To consider the Committee's response to the proposed Stopping-up Order.

1. Information

- 1.1 We have received a letter from the Department for Transport giving notice of the proposal to make an Order under section 247 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 to authorise the stopping up of an area of land comprising highway verge lying a the north end of Antony Close at Bishopstone, Seaford.
- 1.2 If the order is made, the stopping up will be authorised only in order to enable development as permitted by Lewes District Council, under reference LW/12/0123 and appeal reference APP/P1425/A/08/2082974.
- 1.3 A map is attached as Appendix A, identifying the area affected by the application.
- 1.4 The Committee are advised that the application LW/12/0123 for the erection of a two bedroomed bungalow was objected to at the Planning & Highways meeting held on 23 February 2013 on the grounds of being out of character, overlooking, unneighbourly and effect on views from the National Park. However, this application went on to be approved by Lewes District Council.
- Objections to the making of the proposed order are required to be made in writing to the Secretary of State, National Transport Casework Team, Tyneside House, Skinnerburn Road, Newcastle Business Park, Newcastle upon Tyne, NE4 7AR by 23 May 2014.
