You are recommended:

1. Consider any comments or concerns concerning the proposed s278 agreement

1. Information

- 1.1 Where a development requires work to be carried out on the existing adopted highway, an Agreement will need to be completed between the developer and the County Council under s278 of the Highways Act 1980. Examples of such works include safety related works such as traffic calming or improved facilities for pedestrians and cyclists, or improvement of the highway or junctions. No work may be permitted within the limits of the publicly maintained highway until the s278 Agreement is completed and a bond (if applicable) secured.
- **1.2** Some minor works are required as part of the Newlands Court Development on Southdown Road and Sutton Avenue.
- 1.3 The work detailed in Appendix A and B includes a new crossover construction, footpath and verge reinstatement and widening to an existing crossover entrance.
- **1.4** ESCC have requested a response by 1 February 2013 should the Committee have any concerns.

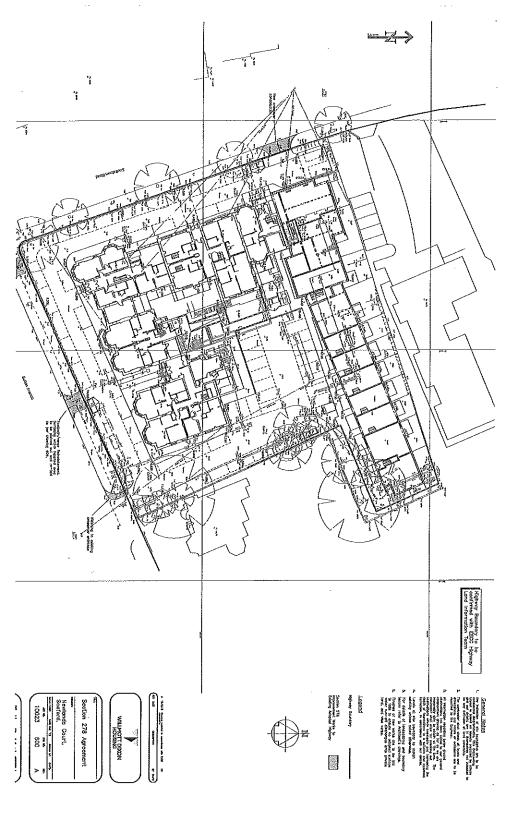

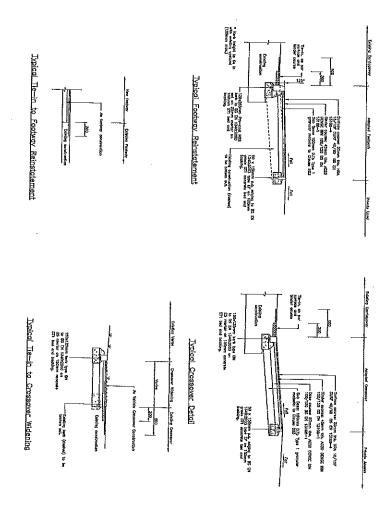

To advise the Committee of a proposed 20mph zone in Sutton

Avenue and Steyne Road Seaford

Recommendations

You are recommended:

1. Consider any comments concerning the proposed 20mph zone in Sutton Avenue and Steyne Road

1. Information

- 1.1 ESCC is developing a 20mph zone along Sutton Avenue and Steyne Road and the side roads as appropriate in Seaford. The other roads affected are Ashurst Road, Dean Road, Heathfield Road, Bramber Road, Chyngton Road, Southdown Road, Fitzgerald Avenue, Links Road, Arundel Road, Micklefield Way, Manor Road, Manor Close, Darwin Drive, Hazeldene and Green Walk.
- 1.2 Sutton Avenue and Steyne Road were the subject of a comprehensive traffic calming scheme in April 2002 which comprised mini roundabouts, zebra crossings, kerb build outs, traffic islands and junction layout improvements. The roads are currently covered by a 30mph speed limit. The post scheme crash record suggests that the traffic calming scheme has been successful in reducing casualties.
- 1.3 In March 2009 ESCC received a petition requesting that a 20mph speed limit be introduced along Sutton Avenue and Steyne Road in the area of the schools and nursery. It was recommended that a part-time 20mph scheme be investigated in light of the emerging Government guidance on 20mph speed limits. The guidance for part time school advisory 20mph speed limit signs has now been published and the benefits of part time 20mph speed limit schemes has not been fully quantified. ESCC are now proceeding with a full time 20mph zone with roundel road markings used as additional speed reducing features and a Vehicle Activated Sign as a



reminder on Arundel Road. Drawings with details of the proposed scheme are attached at Appendix A and B.

1.4 ESCC have requested a response by 28 February 2013 should the Committee have any comments.

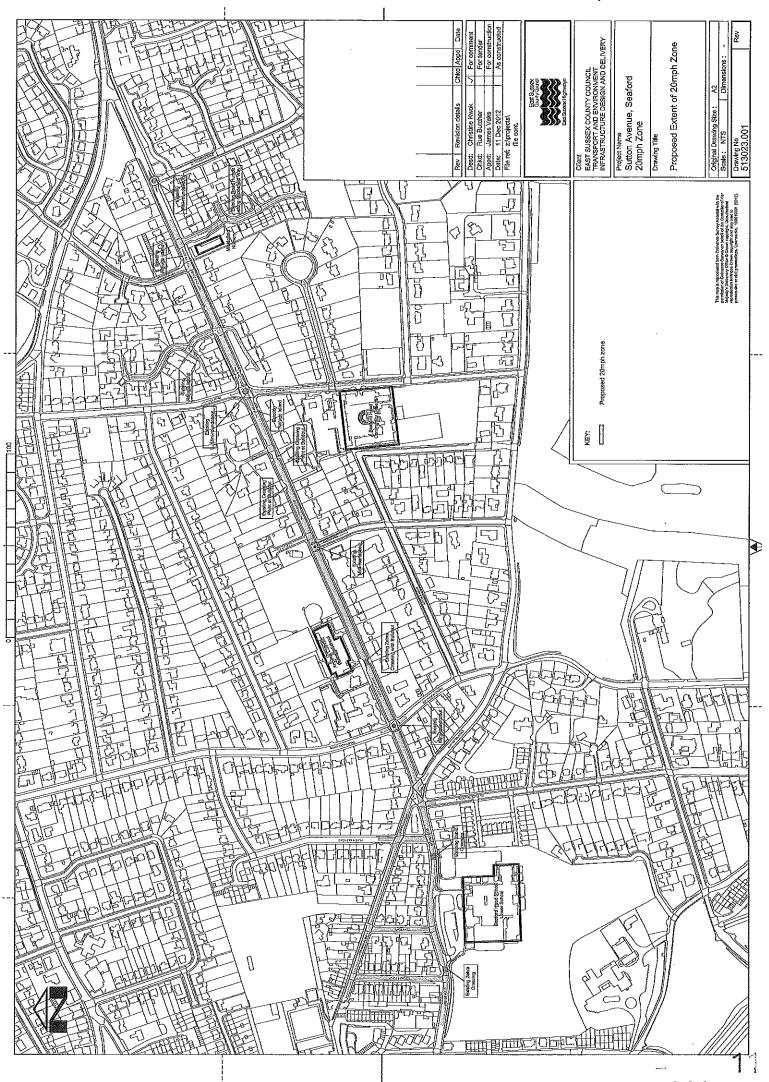

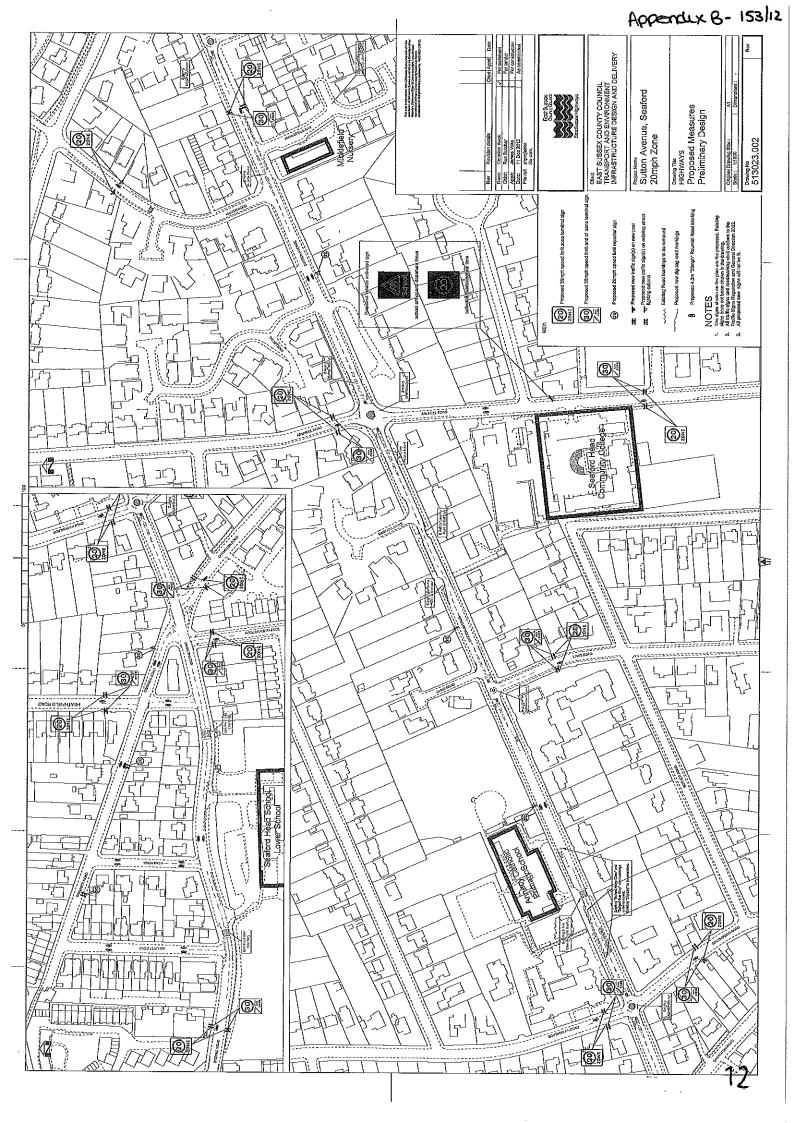

1. Information

- 1.1 A notice has been submitted to Lewes District Council by Mr Andrew Bickerton of UK Triathlon the organiser of the South Coast Triathlon event requesting that Marine Parade and The Esplanade be closed on 6 July 2013 to facilitate the Cycling part of the event. The event begins at 08.30.
- 1.2 The Esplanade will be closed between Cliff Gardens and Marine Parade and Marine Parade will be closed between The Esplanade and Claremont Road. The closure will be in effect between 08.30 and 17.00 on that day. A map detailing the area to be closed is attached as appendix A.
- 1.3 The application indicates that the proposal has been discussed with the Police at the Sussex Police Contact Centre.
- 1.4 Lewes DC have requested the Council pass on any general observations it might have upon the notice and to advise whether or not it considers an Order under Section 21 of the Town Police Clauses Act 1847 be made. They would like a response by 20 February 2013.

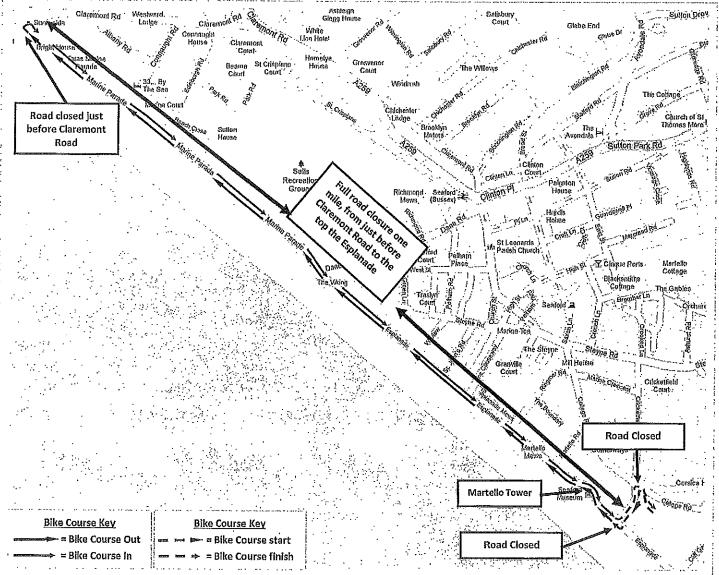

You are recommended:

1. Consider the contents of this report.

1. Information

- 1.1 The Planning Minister has made an announcement relating to the proportion of money local communities will receive from the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL).
- 1.2 Information currently available is that communities who draw up a Neighbourhood Development Plan (which needs to be formally examined and be approved by the local community at referendum) and make an effort to encourage more housing to be built locally, will be eligible for 25% of the revenues received from the CIL, arising from chargeable development within their community.
- 1.3 Communities without a Neighbourhood Development Plan will receive a capped 15% share of the CIL for their areas.
- 1.4 Currently further details, such as what the funding can be spent on, are still to be confirmed.
