Reference was also made by Councillor Penny Lower to a recent meeting of CAN (Community Action Newhaven) to discuss the proposed Port Access road and the related Bretts Aggregates application

The final decision on the construction of the road was dependant on the approval by the Department for Transport of a business plan due to be submitted by East Sussex County Council.

The original planning approval for the road had been granted in 1996. The plans included a flyover across the railway line which would have a significant impact on the whole area
