

# **HOT TOPICS**

Seaford Town Council is keen to try and develop the relationship with the residents of the town and public. One area we felt that was identified as a weakness was the lack of communication, openness and transparency. We recognise that good communication is vital and are therefore committed to improve the channels of communication.

There are certain methods that the Council can use to share information:

**New Website:** staff are working on getting the new website live; this job has now taken priority. Once live, the Council would welcome feedback from residents on anything they would like to see included or amendments they feel need to be made. The aim of the website is to have a point of reference where the Council and members of public can easily access information.

Agendas and Minutes: for each Committee and Council meeting, agendas, reports and minutes are created. This is a legal requirement and an ideal media through which the public can keep abreast with the current work and future plans of the Council. The documents are uploaded to the website each time for downloading, a link posted on the Council's Facebook page and a hard copy held with Tourist Information at 37 Church Street. An email distribution list is also used for emailing out the documents. If anyone would like to be included on the email distribution list, please let us know by emailing admin@seafordtowncouncil.gov.uk.

**Facebook:** the Council were instructed to create a new Facebook business page earlier this year and in doing so lost a lot of followers to the page. # **HOT TOPICS**

Back in January revised plans for Seaford's Household Waste & Recycling Site on the Cradle Hill Industrial Estate to remain open three days per week, Friday to Sunday, were approved by East Sussex County Council.

This came further to the initial proposal to close the site all together seeing an 8,700 strong, signed petition submitted to ESCC opposing the proposal.

East Sussex County Council are unable to confirm a date that the changes will take effect as negotiations are still in process between the County Council and Veolia.

### Seaford Museum:

Since the end of May the lease with Seaford Museum has progressed well. At the Council meeting on 19 June the Council discussed a request from the Museum to have the Council cover the cost of the buildings insurance for Martello Tower. It was decided that the Council would cover this.

Before finalising the lease, the Museum has stated that they wish to be registered as a charity.

At the meeting the Mayor, Cllr Mark Brown, gave a public apology on behalf of the Council to the Chairman of Seaford Museum & Heritage Society for the way in which the lease has been handled previously.

### **Hurdis House:**

At the Finance & General Purposes Committee meeting on 1 May, it was approved that the Council change its policy on the future of Hurdis House and consider continuing to rent out the property to new tenants.

This process is ongoing. There are unresolved issues with the tenant of the ground and lower ground floors that are continuing to be worked on. Approval will need to be sought from the Finance & General Purposes Committee before new tenants are in place for the second and third floors.

The Rotary Clock outside Hurdis House is due to be repaired. A works order has been placed with Smiths of Derby and we expect the work to be carried out by September.

# ALTS RECREATION GROUND

# **HOT TOPICS**

Seaford Town Council are aware that currently, due to the removal of equipment, the play area at The Salts is not as well equipped as it should be.

Following the first stage of public consultation towards the end of 2013, a development plan was produced for the whole site; this took into account <u>all</u> sports and activities at The Salts as well as highlighting many of the aspirations for the future.

The development plan allows us to set out which activities receive attention and much needed funding first. The children's play space is without doubt the first priority and an estimated budget has been considered so that we can soon consult on suitable designs for the play space.

Considering its value to Seaford and the location of the recreation ground and with the prospect of more significant leisure facility options being posed early in 2014, the Iconic Facilities feasibility study was commissioned in partnership with Lewes District Council and Wave Leisure. This feasibility study in conjunction with the development plan now provides the most holistic range of options for the site.

With plans progressing the intended result is; better use of the space, better care, achieving modern standards for play space, sport and recreation; and restoring The Salts as a place that Seaford can be proud of.



# RD LIBRARY

East Sussex County Council has advised that the new facility on Sutton Park Road will be opening on Tuesday 26 August 2014. This is an innovative development which will bring a new library and services for older people under one roof

The temporary library on Blatchington Road will be closing on 2 August to allow for the books and resources to be transferred to the new building.

At the centre of the development will be a café, for which East Sussex County Council is currently looking for an operator, and other facilities include meeting rooms, interactive screens, a teen area, a study room and a roof terrace.

Seaford Town Council, at its meeting on 19 June, appointed a Councillor Linda Lord to support the Library with the design and installation of outside seating.

## HOT TOPICS

Seaford Town Council and Lewis District Council have recently been working closely to organise repairs to Splash Point in Seaford. This will make it accessible to the public once again following damage during storms earlier in the year. Whilst neither Council owns the facility it was deemed to be a project in need of public funds as it is so well used by local residents and visitors alike.

Both Councils agreed to donate £10,000 to the project. The contract was awarded to local company C J Thorne & Co Ltd of Uckfield on 26 June. A company that have undertaken similar projects in Brighton and Eastbourne.

It is expected that all the work will be completed within the next six weeks or even sooner.



DEPUTY YOUNG

In June the Mayor, Cllr Mark Brown, and Young Mayor, Millie Hemsley, gave talks at three school assemblies with regards to holding elections for a Deputy Young Mayor.

Cllr Brown is working directly with Seaford Head School to arrange the elections with a view to having a Deputy Young Mayor appointed before the end of the school term at the end of July.

Once appointed, an announcement will be made.
