- 1. The Committee was informed at the last meeting that Phase 4 of the proposed development at Newhaven Harbour, the large concrete block-making facility had been withdrawn
- 2. The plans have therefore been formally amended to leave only the first three phases. In the withdrawal letter of 2nd February the applicants' agents stated that as the first three phases were separate from phase 4, it could be severed from the overall scheme without the need for any further consultation
- 3. ESCC has however invited responses prior to the application being reported to its Planning Committee (probably) next month
- 4. When the Committee considered its initial response to the application at the meeting on 7th December 2017 it was resolved to object on grounds of landscape and visual impact, impact on Tidemills and East Beach, impact on wildlife habitats, general environmental issues and divergence from the Newhaven Harbour Plan
- 5. Most of these objections would still be relevant despite the withdrawal of Phase 4. Also it should be noted that, if the amended application is granted and the first three phases are Implemented it would be open to the applicants to reintroduce phase 4 on the grounds e.g that the necessary infrastructure is in place and that the scheme is not viable without the block making plant. In other words, the first three phases facilitate Phase 4.
- 6. **RECOMMENDATION**: The Committee is recommended to consider whether any additional Comments should be forwarded to the County Council on the amended application

- 1. The Town Council has received formal notification from the East Sussex County Council that due to budget cuts, it proposes to reduce the number of urban grass cuts per season from 6 to 2. Comments are invited before the end of March for consideration by the Lead Member in May.
- 2.A map of the road verges and amenity areas affected was supplied but, as it was indecipherable, a schedule of roads has been requested. Also further information has been requested on the open areas where currently the Town Council pays 'Special Expenses' to the District Council for upkeep. As soon as the County Council responds, this additional information will be forwarded to members.
- 3. The Town Council has been offered two options. Firstly a financial contribution to STC of £6715.00 to cover the two remaining cuts and to enable it to commission its own services or secondly for STC to pay £13,431.00 for the extra 4 cuts.
- 4. Neither option is practicable as notification has been received too late for the settlement of the Town Council's budget for 2018/9. The County Council should have been aware of this problem.
- 5.Local amenity societies have been made aware of the proposals. The response from the Tree Wardens is positive in that the reduced frequency of cuts would encourage the wildlife potential of the verges. They would however wish to liaise with the County Council over the timing of the verge cutting, fertiliser application etc.
- 6. The Natural History Society's response is similarly positive.

7.RECOMMENDATION: The Committee is requested to consider the County Council's proposals and to forward comments for consideration by the Lead Member

SUBJECT: TRAFFIC SENSITIVE STREETS

- 1.East Sussex County Council are carrying out a review of streets in the County designated under s.64 of the New Roads and Street Works Act 1991 as 'traffic sensitive'.
- 2. This designation allows the Highways Authority to require companies carrying out road works (e.g utility companies) to give greater advanced warning of proposed works.
- 3. The last review was carried out 12 years ago. As part of this review ESCC is consulting local authorities and other interested parties.
- 4. The schedule of designated 'streets' in Seaford is appended to this report. There are three different categories of restrictions depending on the colour of the street in the schedule.

Orange streets require additional advance warning for all proposed works

Blue streets: the 'sensitive street' restriction runs from 0700 to 1900 Monday to Saturday

Green streets: the 'sensitive street' restriction applies on weekdays from 0700 to 0930 and 1600 to 1900
