

Suitability	South Bank Homes Ltd had an earlier application to develop Phase 1 refused on 11 June 1992, and one of the 4 grounds was "the proposals do not make adequate provision for Public Open Space and therefore conflict with the provisions of Policies 4.70 and 4.115 of the Seaford Local Plan". Subsequent applications were approved as this requirement was deemed to have been adequately addressed. The amenity land then passed into maintenance at public expense.
