A variety of live entertainment captivated the crowds in Broad Street at the main stage with fabulous local bands, choirs and groups performing throughout the day. Tansley's street performance stage hosted a mixture of singers, along with Stix Drummers who were drumming around town.

Santa, Mrs Claus, and his merry elves were kept very busy throughout the day in Santa's Grotto, run by Seaford Musical Theatre, based in the Barn Theatre. Children were thrilled to be able to meet Santa and have their photo taken too.

Referendum

Seaford Neighbourhood Plan result is in and the Town voted YES!

Following almost four years of dedicated work by a team of hard working local residents the referendum yesterday supported all of their efforts.

The result of the referendum is as follows:

Yes - 5566 (89%)

No - 673 (11%)

Rejected - 23

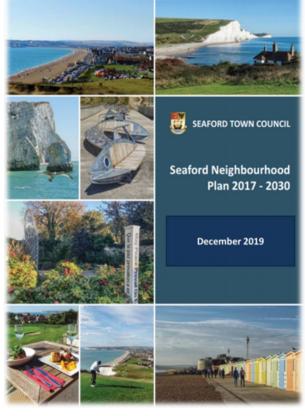
Turnout 31.8 % (national average for larger towns is about 20%)

So what does this mean for Seaford?

- Immediately the amount of CIL funds coming \Rightarrow from the Newlands site to the Town should increase from approximately £150,000 to £250,000.
- All other new qualifying developments will now pay 25% CIL to the town instead of 15%.
- The nine green spaces listed on the plan \Rightarrow receive the highest possible protection, the 52 other open spaces and recreation spaces receive higher protection than they currently have.
- All new housing (that must be accommodated) is on brown field sites, i.e. land that has previously been developed.
- Over 100 affordable homes should be built.
- Strict restrictions will exist on new building within the several conservation areas in the town.

Seaford Gets Plastic Free Status!

Seaford Town Council was pleased to hear the news that Seaford has achieved a plastic free status, thanks to local resident Claire Sumners and Plastic Free Seaford for their hard work. Seaford Town council has been pleased to play its part for example plastic Free status at The View at Seaford Head.

We would like to pass on the article below from Plastic Free Communities:

Seaford is Awarded 'Plastic Free Communities' Status as it Takes Action on Single-Use Plastic.

Seaford has joined a network of communities across the UK who are leading the way to tackle throw- away plastic at source. The town has been awarded Plastic Free Community status by marine conservation charity, Surfers Against Sewage (SAS), in recognition of the work it has done to start reducing the impact of single-use plastic on the environment.



Local resident Claire Sumners (pictured left) started the campaign in March 2018 after running beach cleans. Claire saw that the community were interested in how to clean up their local beach and how they could learn to stop using and buying single use plastic and disposables.

Registering with the SAS Plastic Free Communities movement, Claire pulled together key organisations and businesses in the town to put in place a five-point plan. The objectives include: setting up a

community led steering group; instigating the SAS Plastic Free Schools education programme; getting local council commitment and working with local businesses, organisations and community groups to spread the word and minimise the amount of disposable plastics they use.

Claire said - "The campaign grew to a stage where I felt I needed help to run it and lucky for me I have the help of Fran Chorlton and Caroline Bond to continue enthusing and advising our community to make a commitment to change. Seaford is listening to us and we have a reputation now of being the plastic free ladies!

...Seaford is full of independent shops and they have been instrumental in getting our message heard. One shop, Scoop and Weigh, has extended their range of bulk foods to buy loose in your own containers. The owner listened to what we wanted to see and put it in place. We are thrilled at this because it encourages residents to shop differently, for the planet.

All of the local Schools took part in a 'Plastic Free Week' in May 2019. This was important to us because we wanted to help schools get the message to students that single-use plastic needs to be given the boot. Subsequently we have had a massive increase in young children and their families

attending beach cleans.

We have been asked to speak at various clubs including Seaford Martello Rotary and they have since bought Green Goblets to use at events instead of single use plastic cups. Most recently, thanks to the support of Seaford Town Council and our co-leads, we had a stall at Seaford Christmas Magic where we spoke to and have advised the community on how to have a waste-free Christmas.

We have always wanted the campaign to be a collaboration between other organisations



who are helping the planet and we have built up relationships with Sussex Wildlife Trust where we talk about how to best look after our coastline and countryside.

Whilst we know a community will never be totally single use plastic free, we hope this campaign evokes change in people's attitude towards convenience and single use. It has been a labour of love at times as it does take time, effort and multitasking to make ourselves heard but as we start a new decade, I know it has all been totally worth it."

The Surfers Against Sewage Plastic Free Community network aims to free the places where we live from single-use. Using the five point plan, the aim is to empower communities to kick start local grassroots action, which can then be built upon...

The marine conservation charity, based in St Agnes in Cornwall, says it wants to unite communities to tackle avoidable plastic from the beach all the way back to the brands and businesses who create it. It says it is not about removing all plastic from our lives but kicking our addiction to throw-away plastic and changing the system that produces it.

Rachel Yates, SAS Plastic Free Communities Project Officer, said: "It's great to see the work that Seaford has done to reduce the availability of avoidable plastics, raise awareness and encourage people to refill and reuse.

We have over six hundred communities across the UK working to reduce single use plastic and the impact it has on our environment. Every step those communities and the individuals in them take is a step towards tackling the problem at source, challenging our throw-away culture and encouraging the habit and system changes we need to see."

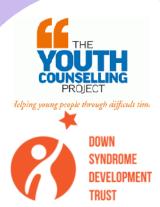
