Public Access to the Venue:

As such, if you arrive after this time, you will not be able to access the meeting.

When members of the public are looking to leave, they must be escorted out of the building by a Town Council officer.

Entrance through the rear fire escape of the building will not be allowed.

Public Participation:

Members of the public looking to participate in the public participation section of the meeting must do so in person, by making a verbal statement during the public participation section of the meeting.

Below are some key points for public participation in the meeting:

- 1. Your statement should be regarding business on the agenda for that meeting.
- 2. You will only be able to speak at a certain point of the meeting; the Chair of the meeting will indicate when this is.
- 3. You do not have to state your name if you don't want to.
- 4. If you are unsure of when best to speak, either query this with an officer/councillor ahead of the meeting or raise your hand during the public participation item of the meeting and ask the Chair – they will always be happy to advise.
- 5. When the Chair has indicated that it is the part of the meeting that allows public participation, raise your hand and the Chair will invite you to speak in order.
- 6. Statements by members of the public are limited to four minutes and you don't automatically have the right to reply. The Chair may have to cut you short if you overrun on time or try to speak out of turn this is just to ensure the meeting stays on track.
- 7. Where required, the Town Council will try to provide a response to your statement but if it is unable to do so at the meeting, may respond in writing following the meeting.
- 8. Members of the public should not speak at other points of the meeting.
- 9. A summarised version of your statement, but no personal details, will be recorded in the minutes of the meeting.

Recommendations

The Committee is recommended:

- 2. To consider the recommended Town Council involvement in Lewes District Council's consultation on the Local Plan to:
 - a. Promote and share Lewes District Council's engagement communications, including its pre-consultation survey mention at section 3.6,
 - b. Attend and promote Lewes District Council-led engagement events in Seaford,
 - c. Attend Lewes District Council-led parish and town councillors' briefing, proposed for 5pm 9th January 2025 but this is to be confirmed,
 - d. Finalise the Town Council's response to the consultation at its Planning & Highways Committee meeting on 20th February 2025.

1. Information

1.1 Lewes District Council (LDC) has announced that the first phase of consultation on the Lewes Local Plan will run from week commencing 6th January to 28th February 2025.

- **1.2** Phase one of the consultation is on the detailed policies for the plan area and will consider sites within towns and a limited number of villages.
- **1.3** The second phase will take place later in 2025 and have a greater emphasis on more rural parts of the district, while also re-evaluating areas considered during phase one.
- 1.4 This report presents LDC's statement regarding its first phase consultation (section 2 of this report) and sets out recommendations for the Town Council's involvement in promoting public engagement and formulating a Town Council response (section 3).

2. Lewes District Council's Statement

2.1 LDC has published the following press release:

'Residents across Lewes district are being encouraged to take part in the latest stage of consultation on Lewes District Council's Local Plan.

Local plans set out where future development will take place, such as new homes and locations for business growth, as well the local policy requirements against which future planning applications will be judged.

Cabinet councillors today (December 5) agreed a first phase of consultation that will run from week commencing January 6 to February 28. Phase one of the consultation is on the detailed policies for the plan area and will consider sites within towns and a limited number of villages. The second phase will take place later in 2025 and have a greater emphasis on more rural parts of the district, while also re-evaluating areas considered during phase one.

Councillor Zoe Nicholson, Leader of Lewes District Council, said:

"My deep misgivings about the government's proposed new housing targets are well known and I will continue to lobby Angela Rayner for a pause and muchneeded rethink. Her current plan simply won't work. It represents a fast and loose charter for developers to dig up our district wherever they like, instead of giving us the resources to build good quality council homes in the right locations.

It is also why we need more residents than ever to join us in having their say and creating a clear and united voice that I hope the Deputy Prime Minister will listen to. So far over 50,000 comments have been fed into the analysis and

assessments carried out by our planning team, which is terrific, but those local views must keep coming in."

Residents will be able to choose from a range of different ways to engage with the consultation. This will include an online webinar that will take place early in the New Year and a series of in-person drop-in events that will begin towards the end of January 2025. These are being organised in collaboration with some of the Town and Parish Councils across the district. An online consultation portal will include a summary and glossary, as well as the full documents on which the council is inviting comments. Paper copies will also be available on request and from the council offices.

Councillor Laurence O'Connor, Cabinet Member for Planning, said:

"These arbitrary government housing targets are just the latest in a long line of obstacles to achieving a real solution to the affordable housing crisis. We need the Deputy Prime Minister to work with us, not against us or we face the prospect of green spaces disappearing forever from towns like Peacehaven and Telscombe - areas which are already being pressured from every side.

During this first phase of consultation in January and February the scope will include potential sites in towns, while the second phase will look at the more rural locations. We need to make sure we gather all the evidence carefully on why we can't meet the government's targets. Our district is constrained by the coast and the South Downs National Park, so we must continue to press the case for this to recognised."

3. Seaford Town Council Involvement

- **3.1** LDC has requested to work closely with parish and town councils to promote its consultation and support engagement with the public.
- **3.2** LDC has held parish and town council clerk steering groups over the last year, where parish and town councils have been able to make suggestions for consultation and engagement techniques that would suit their communities.
- **3.3** Seaford Town Council has, along with other parish and town councils at the steering group, already positively influenced the timing of the first phase

consultation by feeding back to LDC recommendations to start in the New Year (as opposed to a previously suggested mid-December start date).

- 3.4 Seaford Town Council has also requested that LDC run Seaford focussed Local Plan engagement events in Seaford – at least twice, one weekday evening and one Saturday morning, at large venues.
- **3.5** These engagement events would not only provide a question and answer on the policies and sites identified in the Local Plan, but they would also support members of the public in responding to the consultation by showing how to submit responses.
- 3.6 Ahead of the consultation, LDC is also running a short survey to find out about local people's understanding of what a Local Plan is. LDC will then use response from the survey to help shape its future communications about the Local Plan. The survey, which will stay open until 5pm on 31st December 2024, also gives respondents the opportunity to join the LDC Local Plan mailing list.
- 3.7 This survey can be completed by anyone here <u>www.lewes-</u> <u>eastbourne.gov.uk/Lewes-Local-Plan</u>
- **3.8** To confirm, a Town Council response not required it is for individual feedback.
- 3.9 LDC has also suggested that that it will run a parish and town councillors' briefing session in early January, it is not confirmed but this is likely to be Thursday 9th January at 5pm (before the Planning & Highways Committee meeting at 7pm).
- 3.10 To allow the Planning & Highways Committee time to consider the Local Plan consultation, and attend relevant LDC-led briefings, it is recommended that the Town Council's response is finalised at its Planning & Highways Committee meeting on 20th February 2025.
- **3.11** For clarity, a timetable of Seaford Town Council's known involvement in the first phase of the LDC Local Plan consultation is below:

6th January 2025: Consultation on Local Plan begins

9th January 2025 (5pm on Teams): town councillor briefing (to be confirmed)

20th February 2025: Planning & Highways Committee to finalise the Town Council's response to LDC Local Plan consultation.

- **3.12** In order for the Town Council to support LDC's consultation engagement, it is recommended that Seaford Town Council officers share all communications about the consultation on its website, social media and noticeboards.
- **3.13** As with all consultations responded to by the Town Council, the Town Council's response will also be shared on its website for members of the public to view.
